

BRONTE MOVERS – CUSTOMER MOVING CHECKLIST

- Decide on contents to be moved versus donated and disposed of.
- If applicable, book the moving elevator and confirm parking arrangements for moving truck.
- Arrange for packing supplies. Moving industry standard boxes should be used; Bronte
 Movers can supply them for you. This will help you stay within your moving estimate.
 Avoid liquor store and grocery store boxes.
- Make appointments with a service technician to disconnect appliances for shipment. (i.e.: plumber, electrician)
- If applicable, obtain written appraisal of antique items to verify value.
- Check furniture for existing dents and scratches.
- Drain equipment: water hoses, gas from lawn movers, snow blowers, whipper snippers, leaf blowers/
- Make a plan to transport small house plants, valuables, etc...
- All loose items are packed in proper moving boxes.
- All electronics are unplugged from a power source & cords tied.
- All pictures are removed from the walls and packed in boxes.
- Fill all boxes full. Partially filled boxes will collapse when staked.
- Tape all boxes on the bottom and top & label all boxes with their destination room. Label directly on the tape if using our box rental program.
- Only clothing may be left in dressers (excluding IKEA & antique dressers or open back dressers).
- All items are removed from top of furniture.
- Ensure that all closets, cupboards and drawers have been emptied.
- Take all valuables, important documents, cash etc... yourself.
- Flat screen TV's need to be taken off walls or stands.

Make your own arrangements to transport/dispose of flammables, chemical & pressurized containers.

Example:

- 1. Aerosol Cans, cleaning fluids, household liquids such as bleach, toilet bowl cleaners
- 2. Oil cans, paint, thinners
- 3. Propane tanks
- 4. Fireworks
- 5. Ammunition
- 6. Gasoline

"Before the loaded truck leaves your home – walk through the entire residence to ensure that no items are left behind."

"When all items are removed from the truck in your new home, check the truck with the driver to ensure no items are left behind."
